

Other Plants to Try

Plants featured in this publication will thrive on minimal care once they are established. Other well-adapted or native plants to try are the following:

Large Trees—Post Oak, Chinkapin Oak

Small Trees—Anacacho Orchid

Medium Shrubs—Japanese Aralia

Small Shrubs—Candelilla, Indian Hawthorne

Vines—Cardinal Climber, Confederate Jasmine, Carolina Jessamine

Groundcovers—Ice Plant (aggressive), Dwarf Natal Plum, Prostrate Rosemary, Purpleheart, Horseherb (aggressive)

Perennials—Pink Skullcap, Amaryllis, Society Garlic, Yarrow, Bi-Color Iris, Gaura, Oregano, Fall Aster

Annuals—Sleepy Daisy, Pansy, Cosmos, California Poppy, Snapdragon, Nasturtium, Portulaca, Profusion Zinnias
