The following categories will be available for Clover Kids in the buying and construction categories: Everyday Living, Fantastic Fashions under \$25, Dressy and Special Interest.

All Clover Kids will be recognized for their participation.

The last area 4-Hers can participate in is

the 4-H Storyboard Contest. The 4-H Fashion Storyboard is an industryinspired method of displaying original designs. The storyboard "tells the story" of the designer's idea. It includes original illustrations, flats and more to promote the current years design brief. The 2017 design brief will be "Inspired by Music".

The Texas 4-H & Youth Development Program and the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation is once again pleased to offer to our senior high school 4-H members and current college students the opportunity to apply for an Opportunity Scholarship through the Texas 4-H Program.



Well over 200 academically-competitive scholarships will be awarded in the 2017 Texas 4-H Scholarship Program ranging in amounts from \$3000 to \$20,000.* No scholarship recipient whose award is based on this application process will receive less than \$3000.*

The deadline to submit this application to the County Extension office is *January 27*, 2017.
