SPONSORSHIPS AVAILABLE:

Sponsorships are available through the Bastrop County 4-H Council for several important leadership activities that take place throughout the year. Sponsorship Applications are available on request from the County Extension Office.

To be eligible for a sponsorship, youth must complete the following tasks:

1. Register for the event(s) listed below
2. Physically attend the event/activity
3. Complete and turn in the Sponsorship Application Form to the County Extension Office

County 4-H Camp:

- Any 4-H member who is enrolled in a Bastrop County 4-H club is eligible to attend camp. Club managers and the Extension office will verify membership. Enrollment in 4-H Connect must be completed and in the Extension office by September 30th of the current 4-H year. Exception: The 4-H'er is a first time enroller.
- 4-H Council will pay 50% of the County 4-H Camp costs if a 4-H member completes and turns in a 4-H Recordbook for the current year
- The 4-H Council will pay the full registration cost for the required number of adult chaperones attending camp (1:8 ratio of adults to youth). Chaperones must be enrolled as a 4-H adult leader in the county, and have been approved through YPS screening. Fuel cost will not be reimbursed.

District 10 Leadership Lab:

- 4-H members age thirteen (as of August 31) and older from Bastrop County may attend. 4-H Council will pay 75% of the lab costs for each participant.
- The Bastrop County Pecan Auxiliary offers a one (1) time scholarship to pay for a portion of a 4-H members' Leadership Lab registration fee.

District 10 4-H Roundup:

- The 4-H Council will **not** reimburse any registration fees or expenses for attending District Roundup competitive events.

Texas 4-H Congress:

- Congress is for older 4-H members who are at least fifteen years of age at the time Congress is held. Congress is held in Austin in even numbered years.
- 4-H Council will pay 75% of the cost of 4-H Congress.

Texas 4-H Roundup:

- The Council will pay for 50% of the cost of the **registration fee** for youth members attending State Roundup in College Station, Texas.
- Council will not pay for lodging, tours, food, parking, tee-shirts, or any additional expenses.

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE:

As information is received regarding scholarships, it will be printed in the 4-H newsletters and other 4-H media. Information will also be posted on the Bastrop County 4-H Scholarship Page at <https://bastrop.agrilife.org/4-h-scholarship-information/>.

Bastrop County 4-H Scholarship Application Process:

- Each applicant must submit a copy of the Scholarship Application Form, complete and turn in a 4-H Recordbook, and sign-up for and complete a scholarship interview in order to be eligible to receive a scholarship.
- *Recordbooks must be complete and have effort put into them in order to be eligible for scholarships. Recordbooks with only a few sentences in each section will not be accepted for scholarship consideration.*

Note: Starting in 2020-2021, Seniors will be required to submit a 4-H Recordbook for the 2 previous 4-H years in order to be considered for Bastrop County 4-H Scholarships. So, they would need to submit a Recordbook during their Junior (2019-2020) and Senior (2020-2021) year of high school.
