

2020 Brazoria County Pecan Show Rules

1. Pecans must be from the current year's crop and have been grown by the entrant. Pecans should be shown in the county where they were grown. Out of county entries are permitted if there is no county pecan show where they were grown (pecans can be entered in only one county pecan show).
2. The grower must enter 50 nuts for each single variety, and multiple varieties from a single grower are accepted. Mixed variety entries will be disqualified. Known hybrids or natives may be entered. Nuts from different trees are permitted so long as they are of the same variety. Pecan varieties will be judged in one of the three divisions: COMMERCIAL DIVISION, CLASSIC DIVISION AND NEW DIVISION, OR NATIVES DIVISION. The NATIVES DIVISION includes entries for the smallest pecan determined by the greatest number of nuts per pound.

The finest nuts should be carefully selected in preparing an entry. Nuts should be uniform in shape, size and general appearance. Entries with nuts that have been cut, sanded, polished or otherwise altered will be disqualified. Avoid entering green nuts or those affected by pests or disease.

3. Each entry must be securely bagged or boxed and include a tag or label with the entrant's name, address, telephone number, and the variety of pecan. If you do not know the variety, label the entry "variety unknown". Any entries not grown in Brazoria County must be labeled as "out of county".
4. All entries become the property of Texas A&M AgriLife Extension – Brazoria County
5. Entries must be submitted by Tuesday, December 1 at 3:00 p.m. at the Brazoria County Extension Office, 21017 CR 171, Angleton, Texas.

Entries will be judged on Friday, December 4, 2020

Results will be exhibited online December 12, Saturday, as part of pecan online education program

Winning entries will be advanced to Texas Regional Pecan Shows by January 6, 2021
