Excitement is in the air! Your child's teacher has formed a partnership with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service of Comal County to enrich the education of your child through the 4-H School Curriculum Enrichment Program. This program is designed to supplement and enrich classroom teaching, not replace the curriculum.

Through involvement in 4-H curriculum projects, youth will have the opportunity to accomplish the following:

- Acquire subject matter skills and knowledge
- Develop problem-solving capabilities
- Develop a positive self-concept
- Learn and use accepted practices for mental, physical, emotional, and social health
- Explore and evaluate career and job opportunities
- Set and achieve other 4-H and personal goals

Your child will be participating in the **Hatching in the Classroom** 4-H School Curriculum Enrichment Program. This is our most popular school program. It is a 21-25 day project that teaches youth the basics of embryological development. It also assists in teaching responsibility, respect and care for life, how to predict outcomes and draw conclusions, and how to observe and record data.

The youth program of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service is the Texas 4-H Youth Development Program. A four-leaf clover with four H's is the symbol of 4-H. We include the 4-H Clover on all of our materials because all youth programming conducted through our agency is a part of the Texas 4-H Program. All youth who participate in our programs have a 4-H experience.
