Texas 4-H Roundup Information

Registration Period: May 1 – May 10, 2022

Reminder! Texas 4-H Roundup registrations opened TODAY at 1pm (May 2nd) for all Senior age division youth who either qualified to compete in a Qualifying Contest or are electing to participate in an invitational contest this summer! **Texas 4-H Roundup registrations will close May 10, 2022** on [4HOnline](#).

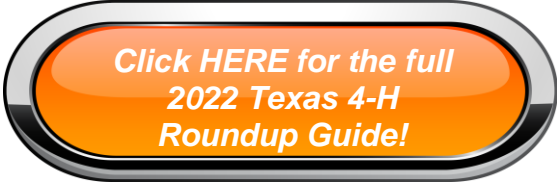
[CLICK HERE](#) for this year's qualifiers for all QUALIFYING State Contests Some contests are not listed on here (such as Range Evaluation, Pasture ID, Wool/Mohair, Fashion Storyboard, Soil Judging & Entomology). Those contests are invitational, which means all Seniors can register for those contests. **Agents, please be prepared to begin approving registrations on May 13th**. This year the team information will be something that we are asking agents to input on their end vs the 4-H member. Qualifying contest should be the **same** team members as they were when they qualified at District. For Invitationals, be sure if you have more than one team, to work with your coaches to determine the team members. We need this information entered at the time of registration approvals. **We ask that all registrations be submitted to the District levels by Wednesday, May 18th**.

NEW

As a reminder, registration will close on Thursday, May 10th. This means on May 10th all registrations should be in **PENDING** Status. Any **INCOMPLETE** registrations on Friday, May 13th will be removed from the system requiring a youth/adult to begin the registration process again at the Late fee rates which will begin on Friday, May 13th.

Other Roundup Tidbits:

- Texas 4-H Roundup will be **requiring all youth and adults in attendance to register**. As noted in the [Roundup Guide](#) released in the fall, there will be a charge by contest this year rather than a flat fee for the week. Contests will be \$25/per contest. In addition, those participating in LEAD Academy will have a \$25/day charge.
- All contestants will be provided a complimentary Texas 4-H Roundup t-shirt again this year. We will be selling additional t-shirts through Marketplace as in the past for non-contestants, parents, and others wishing to purchase. T-shirts must be picked up at Roundup, they will not be mailed. We also have worked to enhance our awards for our contestants this year as well.
- Also, all required forms will be uploaded into the registration system at time of registration. Many of these forms must be signed by a parent/guardian.

District 10 4-H Horse Show – Dripping Springs, TX

Registration Period: May 2 – May 16, 2022



The 2022 District 10 4-H Horse Show will be held on June 15-16, 2022 at Dripping Springs Ranch Park (1042 Event Center Drive Dripping Springs, TX 78620) Agents should carefully review the attached **INFORMATION LETTER** and provide the information to 4-H members/families so that they can register for the event. ***Note:** ALL Horses must have been validated by May 1, 2022 in order to compete at this event.

State Horse Show Qualifying Information: District 10 will offer 27 classes in Divisions that make up the Qualifying Show. A 4-Her must show in at least one class in a Division in order to 'qualify' for the State 4-H Horse Show in that particular division. *Example: A futurity project horse must be shown at District in order to qualify for a futurity division at the State Show.* Review the **packet** to see how the divisions are grouped.

Important Price Updates: Stalls & RV space prices have increased from last year: Stall fees are \$25 and RV space is \$45. Additionally, if stalls are rented, families are required to purchase shavings from the Dripping Springs facility. Price is \$9.00 a bag and require a minimum of 2 bags per purchase.

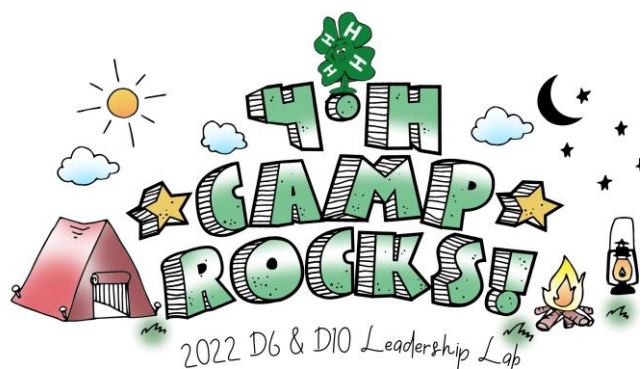
COST:

\$250 per Youth & \$220 per Agent. The cost includes all meals. It **DOES NOT** include transportation to and from Camp Kubena or Lunch on Wednesday (June 29th).

PAYMENT:

Recommend registrants pay for their fees using credit card or debit card via 4HOnline. **Any Payments submitted by county/club check through 4-HOnline are due to Texas A&M AgriLife Extension by June 13, 2021.** No personal checks will be accepted. Payments will not be processed until registration is accepted at the District level, this will happen at the close of registration.

District 10 4-H Council Officer Elections

2022-2023 District 10 4-H Council officers will be elected during **District Leadership Lab on June 29-July 1, 2022** at Camp Kubena. Job descriptions for each office are attached along with the District Bylaws. **Any 4-H'er who has ATTENDED LEADERSHIP LAB AT LEAST ONE YEAR PRIOR TO THIS YEAR is eligible to seek an office.**

***Members who attended our virtual District Officer Elections on June 25, 2020 are also eligible.**

- **How to Apply:** Qualified delegates interested in seeking Council office must apply **by completing the** application on the District 10 4-H Website: <https://d104-h.tamu.edu/district-4-h-council/> starting **May 5, 2022** and submitting no later than **May 31, 2022**. **Applications will be accepted online only. It is the candidate's responsibility to ensure their application was received. No late applications accepted.**

2022-2023 Texas 4-H Chartering Instructions

**Emily has shared Texas 4-H Chartering packets with Club Managers! Please let me know if you have any questions*

The 2022-2023 4-H Year is just around the corner! All 4-H clubs that intend to operate and open for enrollment MUST have a charter submitted & approved on 4HOnline. Please utilize the [State Chartering Instructions & Guidelines Packet](#) for information regarding the 2022-2023 Chartering Process.

Remember! ALL 4-H Clubs Must Have:

- [Charter Application Worksheet](#) for Club/Group Managers to complete and use to fill out information in 4HOnline - This form is simply a worksheet and **should not be uploaded** as part of the chartering process.
- [2022-2023 Charter Agreement](#) (Must be signed by CEA/CED)
- Bylaws: The Sample Bylaws (Download: [Word Doc](#)) are developed to serve as a guide for clubs/groups to use in bylaw development and/or revision. Chartered clubs/groups have flexibility with their bylaws; however, **the items in bold in the sample set are required to be in all bylaws** ([See Bylaws Requirements](#)). When you review the sample bylaws, you will notice fewer bolded/required items. This does not mean you have to change your bylaws, as long as they meet the minimum requirements, which they should if they were in compliance last year. Club/group bylaws may also not conflict with the Texas 4-H Rules and Guidelines and/or the charter agreement.

ONLY CLUBS with a 4-H BANK ACCOUNT MUST HAVE:

- [2021-2022 Financial Review Form & Asset List](#) (Must be signed by CEA/CED)
- One Copy of Previous Bank Statement for each account: Bank statements uploaded as part of the chartering packet **should not include copies of canceled checks**. This is for security of the club/group account(s).

Helpful Chartering Tips:

If a club is renewing its charter, the Club name **MUST** match what we have on file in our current system.

If clubs alter or abbreviate their club name and/or their club name is listed inconsistently in any of the documents above, it will be rejected by the State Office.

Please triple check that the signatures of reviewers on the Financial Review Form are NOT club managers, volunteers, or members of the club. They must be outside parties who sign that form.

Do not leave any fields BLANK on the Financial Review form except for the Asset List if no assets exist.

Do not use the word "County" in your 4-H Club names. Ex: "Bexar County 4-H" should be "Bexar 4-H".

Reminder! Texas 4-H Congress Registrations **CLOSES** May 30th!

- **Information:** Youth who have been selected as a House/Senate Delegate (See Official District 10 Selection List [HERE](#)) will need to register for Texas 4-H Congress no later than **May 30, 2022** on [4HOnline](#). **Applicants must also submit a Bill in order to attend.** See Bill Submission Instructions here: <https://fs4.formsite.com/state4h/bill/index.html?1643920608281>
