- 2. Queen Contestants must be 14 through 19 years of age and Princess Contestants must be 8 and in the 3rd grade or 9, years of age though 13 years of age as of August 31. The Queen and Princess will be selected for poise, beauty, personality, western attire, and horsemanship.
- 3. Entry Forms are due by Wednesday, February 1, 2017. Obtain applications from the association secretary or the Extension office. Send entries to princess/queen contest superintendent or to the Extension office.
- 4. Entry fee is \$20.00.
- 5. There will be three practice sessions. Contestants and their horses are required to attend and participate in at least two if the practice sessions.
- 6. The Queen and Princess must be present at all contests for awards presentations and help in other activities as she is asked to do so by the Livestock Show, represent the Livestock Show Association in fairs, rodeos, parades, etc. throughout the year, when possible, and be present for the crowning of the Following year's winners.
- 7. Current princess/ queen and all contestants will be required to work during the HCLS Premium Auction. Any absences must have board approval in advance. Any contestants absent without board approval will be disqualified.
- 8. Previous winners are ineligible
- 9. Judges for Queen/ Princess Contest must not reside in Henderson County unless approved by the board.

During my HCLS Queen and Princess involvement...

- 1. I am expected to attend all sessions that are part of the planned program for all activities. I will inform staff if I am not feeling well or have a schedule conflict.
- 2. I will dress appropriately to the occasion and adhere to any attire requirements stipulated for the event I am attending. Appropriate dress includes a collared shirt, sash, and nice pants/jeans. No caps or shirts with logos are to be worn while performing my duties as queen/princess. A queen or princess contestant should be courteous, clean, and possess good manners.
- 3. Language must be controlled and appropriate for a young person— I will not use language that is socially offensive.
- 4. Except for planned tours and outings, I will not leave an activity facility any time without permission of the chaperone and/or staff responsible for the event. (See schedule/responsibilities)
- 5. Any participant at an official Queen and Princess activity who observes a breach of the code of conduct has the responsibility and obligation to report the misbehavior to appropriate chaperones.
- 6. There will be three practice sessions. Contestants and their horses are required to attend and participate in at least two if the practice sessions.

A good, clean cut, all American girl who wears western clothes with a flair, besides being and looking comfortable in them. A girl who can ride a horse and feel at home in the saddle. She commands the respect of all who meet her. She shows good sportsmanship, has knowledge of the history of the Henderson County Livestock Show, and can set an example for others who follow in her footsteps.

In the contest you will go by our first name only and by entry numbers. This number will be determined as your entry form is received.

Three judges from outside Henderson County have been selected for fair and unbiased judging. There will be 3 categories:

- 1. Horsemanship
- 2. Poise, beauty and personality
- 3. Western Attire

Each category counts 33 1/3 percent, with one judge for each category. Tabulations will be done by official tabulators, and only they will know the results until it is announced.

The contest awards are:

- 1. Queen or Princess
- 2. 1st Runner-up
- 3. Horsemanship
- 4. Miss Western Attire
- 5. Miss Congeniality (voted by the contestants)
- 6. Personal interview

You will be judged twice:

- 1. Modeling and Interviews (personal interviews are for 5 minutes with the 2 judges)
- 2. Horsemanship and Interview
