Phlox paniculata 'Victoria

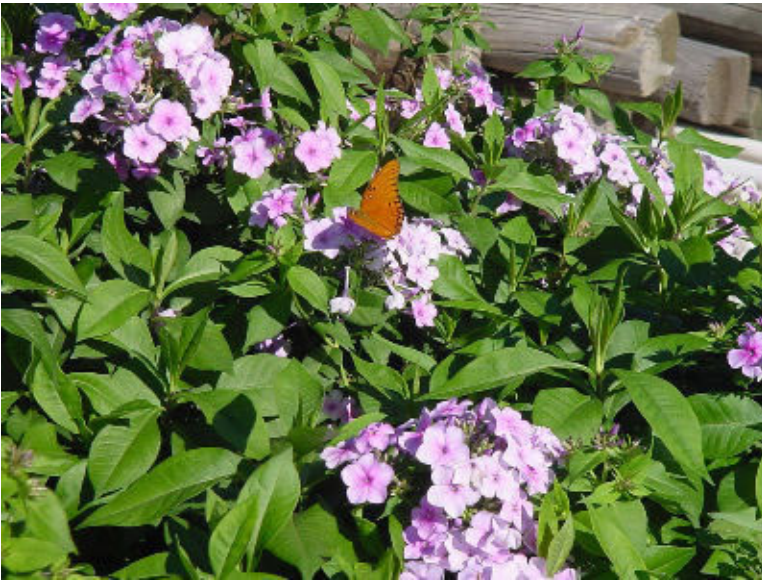
Morning sun/afternoon shade

2'-3' x 3'

**Pink blooms,
June - August**

Evergreen foliage

Culture: Phlox needs morning sun, afternoon shade. For best results, plant in good organic soil. Give phlox a lot of water and mulch well. Plant it by rooted cuttings in early spring or late fall. It is heat and drought resistant after it is established. Propagate phlox by division or cuttings.

Growth Habit: This perennial grows 2'-3' tall. Garden phlox is more effective if planted in groups. It may need staking.

Bloom: If old blossoms are removed, the plant produces dark pink flowers from June – August. Another variety, 'John Fanick', which has a later bloom time produces light pink blossoms with a dark pink eye.

Notes: To avoid powdery mildew, remove every third stem before it blooms. Garden phlox are also known as summer phlox; many varieties exist. 'Victoria' and 'John Fanick' are Texas Superstars™.
