Welcome to the Jack County 4-H program!

Texas 4-H is the youth development program of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service. 4-H is a club for kids and teens starting at 3rd grade. The purpose for this program is for boys and girls to earn the opportunity to learn by doing and develop the leadership, knowledge, attitudes, and skills they need to grow to be caring and contributing members of society.

Youth members are required to pay a \$25.00 participation fee if enrolled by October 31st and a \$30.00 fee from November 1st to the close of the 4-H year. Adult volunteer leaders are registered each year also and it is a \$10.00 applicant fee. CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS ONLY

Youth, Kindergarten- 2nd grade, are 4-H Clover Kid members. The Clover Kid program is a noncompetitive learning experience, to build social skills through projects and activities, with no charge of membership. All Clover Kids who participate will receive a participation ribbon.

All members must enroll on Texas <u>4-H Online 2.0</u>

<u>Clovers and 3rd graders begin registering on September 1st for correct fees to be charged.</u>

*If you have previously been a member of Texas 4-H using 4-H Connect; Your login information and password will stay the same. *
