#### **Attention Soil Judgers**



#### **4-H Meeting Attendance**

It is important for 4-H'ers and parents to remember to attend your meetings on a monthly basis. 4-H'ers must attend 4 of the 6 meetings at their enrolled 4-H club and can not attend more than 2 meetings in one month from August to May 2018 in order to exhibit at the 2018 Jim Wells County Fair.

New 4-H members must attend 3 club meetings before the Fair in order to participate. New members are youth who have never been in 4-H before and are just joining. Check with your club managers on your attendance at club meetings.

#### 2018 State 4-H Horse Validation

Validation will be open March 1<sup>st</sup>—April 15th at \$10 per validation and \$20 from April 16 until May 1. Remember:

- horses must be validated on 4-H Connect every year.
- only one validation per horse each year is necessary (horses do not need to be validated under each siblings name).
- If the horse is registered then the registration papers must be uploaded during validation. The uploaded papers must be legible and the owner must be listed as the 4-Her, or a member of the 4-Hers immediate family (parent, sibling, grandparent, legal guardian). A bill of sale or a signed transfer request will NOT suffice. Families should apply for and receive the corrected papers prior to uploading in 4-H Connect.
- if the horse is grade (unregistered) then the field designated for the upload of registration papers should be left blank.
- pictures need to be a visual representation of the horses color and markings (head and legs must be visible in right and left profile images and lighting should be sufficient to determine coat color).

Remember by validating your horse project, you are eligible to compete in the District and State 4-H Horse Show this summer. District 12 will not be hosting a district horse show; however, we will be invited guests to another districts horse show. We will be guests; therefore, need to be courteous to everyone involved in their program or will not be invited to participate in the future. I will release more information on the horse show as soon as all of the horses are validated and not prior to the end of validation.


We are taking volunteers who would like to assist or help chaperone for the evening.
