

DISTRICT 7 HORSE JUDGING CONTEST GUIDELINES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

AGE DIVISIONS

The following contestant ages are as of August 31, 2018:

- JUNIOR – minimum age 8 and in the 3rd grade - 8th grade
- SENIOR – grades 9th- 12th (Max age 18 as of August 31, 2017)

FEES

- \$12 per individual (11:59pm, Feb. 22)
- Late Fee: \$15 per individual after that date/time

DO NOT SEND MONEY TO THE DISTRICT OFFICE

Registration must be done online on www.judgingcard.com.

ENTRIES

County Extension agents will need to complete District Team Entry Form and send to District Office.

Teams:

Any number of teams may enter the contest, the top three (3) senior teams will advance to State Roundup. Therefore, all members of each team must be decided upon before the contest and maintained throughout the contest. Only Senior age 4-H members can be on a Senior team. Counties that have one (1) intermediate and three (3) Juniors (or 2 and 2) have to compete based on the oldest member of the team or compete as individuals.

CHECK-IN

On the day of the contest participants will need to register with the District 7 Horse Judging Committee in addition to the Panther Creek FFA officials. **Scantrons** will be provided by the District Office.

CLASSES

Eight classes will be judged, consisting of four halter classes and four performance classes. Classes will be presented as to availability of quality animals.

ORAL REASONS

- Junior contestants will NOT give oral reasons. (Juniors will answer questions)
- Senior contestants will give TWO sets of oral reasons on two classes, one set on halter class and one set on performance class. Pending quality of classes contestants shall be notified of the classes that reasons will be taken on.
