PURPOSE:

The Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassador Program aims to project a clear and accurate image of the Texas and Navarro County 4-H & Youth Development Program. More specifically, the purpose is to:

Help younger youths develop leadership and communication skills and prepare them for duties as an Ambassador.

Help the public understand the full scope of the 4-H program.

Recruit new members from diverse backgrounds.

To tell and show key audiences what the 4-H and Youth Development Program is and who it impacts, so that these audiences will understand the impact of 4-H on the lives of young people and will see how it addresses key youth issues in the community.

To make families, youths, and communities more aware of 4-H and the benefits it offers.

TEAM MEMBERS:

Navarro County 4-H youths will be selected to serve as 4-H Junior Ambassadors on an annual basis. 5 youth will be selected to serve as 4-H Junior Ambassadors in any given 4-H year. The number of Junior Ambassadors is the decision of the supervising County Extension Agent.

Members must apply, interview and be accepted annually.

Interviews will be held annually by a panel of 2-3 judges. These judges will review applications, essays and interview each candidate. Following these interviews, this panel will determine participants for Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassador Program.

2020 Interview Date: The week of July 20th-24th.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

The role of a Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassador is quite demanding and requires 4-H boys and girls who are dedicated, mature, dependable, & very interested in the purposes of the Junior Ambassador Program. The number of 4-Hers selected each year to serve as Junior Ambassadors is determined by the County Extension Agent(s) who supervises the Junior Ambassador Program. The number is based upon need, number of clubs, program demands, and yearly goals for the Junior Ambassadors, and the number of eligible applicants.

Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassadors must meet the following requirements to be considered for selection as a Junior Ambassador:

- Be entering the 4th – 8th grade for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Must have been a member of 4-H for a minimum of one year at the time of submitting the application (this does not include Clover Kid years).
- Submit a complete application and go through an individual interview with a panel of selected judges.
- Meet all activity requirements by the application deadline of the current 4-H year to be considered for renewal.
- Must have participated in at least 1 community service activity as an individual, as a group member, or in a club type project.
- Must be academically eligible
- Must be in good standing as a 4-H member.
- Must agree to the Obligations and Activity Requirements as stated in this source book.
- Must apply each year to become a Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassador; applications are due to the Navarro County Extension Office by **July 10, 2020.**

ACTIVITY REQUIREMENTS:

Each Junior Ambassador must participate in a minimum of 80% of Junior Ambassador sanctioned activities and County 4-H Competitions to be eligible to re-apply for Junior Ambassador or Ambassador next year. Attendance will be kept for all activities.

If accurate number of requirements are not met, the Junior Ambassador may lose the privilege of serving as a 4-H Ambassador. However, the Junior Ambassador may attempt to seek membership renewal by meeting face-to-face with an advisory board. The advisory board members will be selected by County Extension Agents.

ATTENDANCE & OBJECTIVES:

4-H Junior Ambassadors must make every effort possible to attend 80% of monthly meetings. If attendance is not possible, notice must be given to the County Extension Agent 24 hours in advance at which time agent will determine if it is an excused absence.

DRESS CODE:

Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassadors are required to dress appropriately for all events in which they are representing 4-H as a Junior Ambassador. For each event, the 4-H Junior Ambassador Advisor will designate which dress is appropriate.

The dress requirements are:

Junior Ambassador Shirt

Khaki Capri's or Pants (no cut-offs, faded Capri's, or holes)

Females: Khaki shorts are accepted but MUST hit the knee

Nice Shoes (NO FLIP FLOPS)

CODE OF CONDUCT:

All Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassadors are required to comply with the Texas 4-H Program's Code of Conduct **AT ALL TIMES**, when participating in ANY 4-H event. The Code of Conduct is printed on the membership enrollment form. If a 4-H Junior Ambassador violates any provision of the Code of Conduct, whether it is minor, intermediate, or major, the situation and documentation must be presented before a board, consisting of one County Extension Agent, two adult volunteer leaders, and two 4-H Junior Ambassadors (selected by the County Extension Agents). This board will meet with the 4-H Junior Ambassador and make a decision whether or not the 4-H youth will be able to continue serving as a 4-H Junior Ambassador.

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS:

Junior Ambassadors are highly motivated, interested, mature & dependable individuals. Problems requiring disciplinary actions rarely occur. In an effort to keep the Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassador Program as one of excellence, disciplinary actions have been developed.

If any Junior Ambassador fails to comply with the Obligations and Activity Requirements section of the application, disregards the uniform requirements, fails to fulfill responsibilities, or represents the Junior Ambassador Program in an unacceptable manner, then the Junior Ambassador will have an opportunity to explain their actions to the County Extension Agent who supervises the Junior Ambassador Program. A written summary of the problem will be made by the Extension Agent and kept on file. Immediate termination from the Navarro County Junior Ambassador Program could result, depending on the nature of the violation.

All Junior Ambassadors will receive 1 warning when they do not fulfill an obligation, or they miss an event for which they volunteer. If this occurs a second time, the Junior Ambassador will meet with the County Extension Agent to review the situation and their service as a Junior Ambassador. The result may be probation or termination. If a Junior Ambassador is dismissed, he/she will not be able to re-apply for the Junior Ambassador Program for a period of one year.

CHANGES TO 4-H JUNIOR AMBASSADOR PROGRAM:

Changes may be made at any time to guidelines, requirements or any other item related to Navarro County 4-H Junior Ambassador Program by County Extension Agents if necessary.
