Keys to the Courthouse

Counties play a major role in the administration of *justice* in Texas. Each county's justice system is based on the county's size. If counties need special help to investigate criminal matters they can call upon the Texas Rangers. These are the components of county law enforcement.

In Texas, a felony case can proceed only after and indictment by a grand jury, unless the accused waives this right. The grand jury is responsible for reviewing evidence in a criminal case to determine if the accused could be guilty of the charge and should stand trial. At least nine of the 12 grand jurors must believe the evidence shows the accused could be guilty and formally vote a true bill before an indictment can take place.

Other than the attorneys and the defendant, there are some other important persons in the county court. The judge acts as a referee during the trial and determines the applicable legal issues. It is the judge's job to make sure legal court rules are followed. The judge must decide what to do if an attorney objects to something said or done in the trial. The judge also keeps order during the trial.

The court reporter's job is to take down every word said by the attorneys, judge and witnesses during the trial. Court reporters have machines that help them take down every word quickly.

The district clerk receives and files papers related to criminal proceedings, issues all processes, and holds all filed documents for use by the court.

Contempt of court is the failure to do what the court orders. It is a crime, punishable by a fine or fail time. The bailiff makes sure the courtroom is quiet and orderly during the trial. He or she also escorts the jury and the defendant in and out of the courtroom at the necessary time.

General Rules

Opened to all home canners in Orange and surrounding counties

All canned products must be in clean, polished standard-make jars imprinted with manufacturer's name.

Use the same brand-name disk, ring and jar. Lids must be free from rust and corrosion.

All jars must be clearly labeled with the name of the product, exhibitor's name and address should be taped to bottom of jar.

All work must be done by the exhibitor and approved canning practices followed, i.e., water bath or pressure canned.

The Committee reserves the right to exclude from exhibition's any product canned by an unsafe canning method, i.e. open kettle, steam canner or microwave.

No exhibitor will be allowed to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties. Anyone violating this rule will be excluded from the exhibition.

Judges may award a 1st place ribbon to any worthy exhibit whether it has competition or

Judges will not award a 1st place ribbon to any unworthy exhibit whether it has competition or not.

No ribbon will be awarded to any article not left in the section.

Exhibits may be picked up immediately after judging or left on display until the afternoon.

All ribbons must be left with exhibits until picked up.

2013-2014 4-H Enrollment



CONTEST RULES

- 1. Participation Age: The Texas 4-H and Youth Development Photography contest will be displayed during the 2014 Texas 4-H Roundup and is open to all senior age 4-H members that have passed their 14th but not their 19th birthday before August 31, 2013. Participants must have been born during the period beginning September 1, 1994 and ending August 31, 1999.
- 2. Eligibility of Photos: All photographs must have been taken by 4-H members between the dates of January 1, 2013 and the time of entry. Photos may be submitted only one time and in only one category to the state photography contest.
- 3. Manipulation of Photos: Photos can only have minor manipulation, touch-up performed for all categories except Digital Darkroom. The only acceptable manipulation includes correction of red-eye, cropping, and straightening of photos. Any other manipulation, edits, to a photo would require the photo to be entered into the Digital Darkroom category.
- **4. Format of Photograph:** Photographs should be taken at the highest resolution possible. Photographs must be in a .jpeg, .jpg, or .gif format. Files submitted may not be larger than 2,048k (2MB). Best of Show winners may be asked to submit a high-resolution file or an original negative, print, or slide. There is no minimum size requirement, however, your photograph must be large enough that it can be clearly evaluated for the contest (i.e. if it is too small, it can be disqualified).
- 5. Number of Entries: A county may have only one entry per class for a total of 15 entries per county, and all entries and entry fees must be submitted DIRECTLY TO THE TEXAS 4-H AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT OFFICE via 4-H CONNECT (registration).
- 6. Entry Fee: A fee of \$10.00 per photograph must be paid for each entry. All entries paid by check must come from the County/Club checking account and made payable to TEXAS 4-H FOUNDATION PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST for all entries.
- 7. Contestants Participating at Texas 4-H Roundup: Photography contest participants do not attend Texas 4-H Roundup unless they are competing in another contest however, if a 4-H member/adult chooses to attend to view the display they may do so, but are required to pay the necessary registration fee.
- 8. Entry Period: All photos must be entered between April 1, 2014 and by midnight on April 15, 2014. All registrations must be

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- submitted on 4-H CONNECT. All club/county checks must be received by April 21, 2014.
- 9. Copyright and Content: Photos that are deemed obscene, vulgar, sexually-oriented, hateful, threatening, or otherwise violate any laws are strictly prohibited. The Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program respects the rights related to copyright laws and intellectual property. All photos should be based on a 4-H members original photograph taken by the 4-H member. Use of a photo from other sources/people without permission is not allowed, and will lead to disqualification of the photo and possibility all entries by the 4-H member. The Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program reserves the right to refuse inappropriate or unsuitable entries.
- 10. Model and Property Releases: Any 4-H member submitting a photograph acknowledges that they have sufficient permission of any recognizable locations or people appearing in their photograph(s). This permission is hereby granted to both the photographer and the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program to publish and use as needed. Documentation should be retained by the 4-H member and will be requested by the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program if needed.
- 11. Disqualification of an Entry: An entry that does not follow the rules or category guidelines will automatically be disqualified. Disqualifications forfeit all entry fees. A general notice specifying reason(s) for disqualification will be sent to the county after Texas 4-H Roundup.

Reasons for disqualification:

- Extremely poor quality (resoultion/size)
- Does not meet category criteria (see category descriptions)
- Inappropriate or unsuitable
- Manipulation of photo beyond what is allowed
- Photo entered into multiple categories
- More than one photo in a category from a county
- Photograph was not entered into 4-H CONNECT
- County did not select/certify photograph to represent county
- Photograph was not certified by county office in timely manner
- Entry fee not paid or only partial fee paid
- 12. Text on Photographs: Beyond the storyboard and digital darkroom categories photographs should not contain "user placed text." This includes such things as comments or titles. Text or wording that is part of the photograph (i.e. photo of a street sign, etc) is acceptable.
- 13. Release of Liability: The Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation and/or its employees/agents involved in the contest will not be held liable for missing, or non-displayed photographs. By entry the 4-H member accepts this release.
- 14. Announcement of Results: Results will be posted after Texas 4-H Roundup on the 4-H website.
- 15. Display and Future Rights Use Rights: By submitting an entry to the contest, the 4-H member grants permission to the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation, and any other public or private agency authorized by the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program, the use, and rights associated to the use of the photographic likeness, in promotional publications, and other media, without compensation. Certain photos maybe used for 4-H program and marketing uses. By entry the 4-H member accepts these conditions of display and future use.
- 16. Judges: Judges will determine the placings. Their decision on all entries is final.

DESCRIPTION OF CATEGORIES

It is extremely important that 4-H members, project leaders, parents, and county Extension agents review the descriptions of each category very carefully. Please do not enter photographs into categories that are duplicates from other categories or ones that do not clearly meet the category description. Photographs that do not meet the description of the category will be disqualified.

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Corn on the cobs A sure sign of Summer



There are many signs that summer is here including hot weather, full swimming pools, and sunlight until after 9 pm! Another sign is that sweet corn is starting to show up at the grocery stores, Farmers' Markets, and street corners. We planted sweet corn on the farm I grew up on so seeing the sweet corn reminds me of my childhood. I'd spend a day or two in the kitchen with my mom, sister, and grandmas freezing sweet corn so we could enjoy eating it throughout the winter.

Currently, the price of a dozen ears of sweet corn at three different grocery stores in Central Iowa is \$6/dozen. Local sweet corn is expected to be in the stores around July 15, later than normal because of the cold, wet spring in the Midwest. The local sweet corn will be a bit cheaper.

When selecting sweet corn, look for the following signs of quality:

- Kernels that are plump. Do not choose ears with kernels that have begun to shrivel or 'dent'.
- Kernels that are 'milky' inside so that when pressed with the fingernail the juice pops out.
- Depending on the variety, yellow corn should have a bright yellow color. White corn should be really
 white.
- Husks which fit snugly around the ear, look fresh, and have good green color. Do not select ears with husks that are dried, yellowed, or straw-colored which are indications of age or damage.
- Shiny dark brown silk is a sign of well-filled kernels. Silk ends should be free from decay or worm injury.

To get the best flavor from sweet corn, it should be eaten as soon as possible after harvesting because the sugars start converting to starches as soon as the corn is picked. If you need to store the sweet corn, leave the corn in the husk and refrigerate as soon as possible. If the corn has been husked, place it in a plastic bag and store in the refrigerator. Corn that has been blanched and cut off the cob can be frozen for 6 months to a year.

Here are some tips for cooking with fresh sweet corn:



- Don't add salt to the water when cooking sweet corn because it will toughen the corn.
- Good, fresh sweet corn does not need to be cooked for long. Try cooking it for just 3 minutes, and see how delicious it can be.
- Two to three medium ears of corn are equivalent to approximately 1 pound, depending on ear size. Two medium ears equal approximately 1 to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of kernels.

Squish your fingers into the mixture for gooey fun.


Apple Smiles

Ingredients:

- 8 each red apples (about 2 1/2 inches in diameter, 2.25 lbs)

Berry Cheesecake Pudding Salad
