Participants will be required to submit a 8X10 photo (for county judging and display) as well as provide a copy of the photo electronically (email or disk). The county contest will follow the guidelines of both the district and state contests with the addition of providing a printed 8X10 copy of the photo.

Categories are as follows: Animals - Domestic; Animals - Wildlife; Catch All; Details & Macros; Dominant Color; Elements of Design; Enhanced; Food; Landscape & Nature (non-animal); Motion/Action; People; Plant/Flora; Sports; Theme (2019 theme is "Promote 4-H") & Travel & Place.

Texas 4-H Roundup is a qualifying and invitational event for youth between the ages of 11 and 18 that have successfully placed in a qualifying event at the district level or signed up to compete in an invitational event at the state level. County and district Roundup's are open to all ages of 4-H members from 9 to 18. Texas 4-H Roundup includes approximately 50 different contests and workshops that test 4-H members on life skills in such attributes are decision making, public speaking, organization, and working with others. Roundup will be held June 10 - 13, 2019 at Texas JUNE 10-13, 2019 🐼 A&M University in College Station.

Recordkeeping and 4-H Record Books

Recordkeeping is a very valuable skill taught to members of the Texas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep project records and have these records reviewed annually by submitting a Texas 4-H Record Book. The primary purposes of completing a record book are for a young person to develop the skills necessary to set goals, work toward achieving those goals, reflect on his/her experiences, and set new and higher goals for themselves. A secondary benefit is to prepare young people for the process of completing quality academic scholarship applications.

- All Star Award (Intermediate Age 4-H Members)
- Letterman Award (Senior Age 4-H Members)

4-H Gold Star Award

The Gold Star Award is the highest county achievement award and will be awarded only once in a member's 4-H career. Counties have award quotas based on the number of senior 4-H members. The following are minimum requirements that must be met.

- The member must be at least a sophomore at the time of application and must have completed at least 3 years in 4-H, including the current year.
- The 4-H member must submit an awards program record book in the year he or she is to be considered for the award.

All record books must be submitted by June 25th. 4-H members that submit a record book and meet the basic requirements are invited to participate in the interview process for this award.
