POND MANAGEMENT FIELD DAY

As many of you know I had a Pond Management Field Day scheduled in May but felt it was only right to postpone it and try to help the citizens of Rains County in the cleanup effort after the devastating tornados. Although cleanup is still going on and homeowners are still recovering, I feel that it is important to continue our programming efforts.

With that being said, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension in Rains, Wood, and Van Zandt Counties will be hosting a Pond Management Field Day on Friday, June 2, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. This program will be held at Greene's Lake, located southeast of Emory.

From Emory—At the intersection of HWY 69 and HWY 19 Go South on HWY 19. Just as you turn on 19, take a Left on FM 3274. Continue down FM 3274 for 4.2 miles until you reach county Road 2300 (if you reach HWY 779, you have gone too far). Take a right on RCR 2300 for .5 mile and then turn left on Greene's Lake Private Drive. Watch for signs leading into the location, or contact the Extension Office for a map.

Our speaker for the day will be Dr. Billy Higginbotham, Extension Wildlife and Fisheries Specialist, from the Texas A&M Research and Extension Center in Overton. Topics will include Pond and Lake Management, Aquatic Weed Identification, Aquatic Weed Control Methods, Stocking Techniques and Rates, Fish Care, and Water Quality.

Two Continuing Education Units (CEU's) will be given for those persons with Private Applicator Pesticide Licenses. One hour of general credit and one hour of IPM will be provided. You will need to have your pesticide license number or driver's license number to sign in for these.

In addition, attendees are asked to bring weed samples from their pond or lake for identification and control methods. The samples will be used as part of the program, and Dr. Higginbotham will identify each weed and discuss control.

We ask that you bring lawn chairs for the program and wear sunscreen, if the day is hot and sunny.
