



### 4-H Academic Eligibility

You must be enrolled in 4-H and be making passing grades in school before you can compete in any 4-H contest. The reason we ask you to notify us so early that you want to compete in contests is because we must check with your school to see if you are passing at least two weeks in advance of the contest. Extension sends a letter to your school with the contest name, date and whether competition will require you to miss any school. We can not excuse you from school unless you have enrolled in 4-H.

Don't forget that it is still your responsibility to let your school know the exact dates you will be absent from school so they will know how to code your absence. If they don't know why you're not at school, you may be given an unexcused absence. You should also get assignments from your teachers before leaving.

If you are not academically eligible to compete, the school will notify a county agent who will let one of your parents know that there is a problem with your grades.




