Earwood Award

This special award is presented to the outstanding Senior 4-H member who is 14-19 years of age.

Edgar Glasscock Award

This Special award is presented to the outstanding junior member ages 9-13 years of age.

Home Economics Award

The home economics award is presented to a 4-Her who has excelled in projects areas relating to family and consumer sciences.

Gold Star Award

Each year two (2) Sutton County 4-H Senior Members will be selected for Gold Star Awards. Applicants must be at least 15 years old as of September 1 (or the current state age requirement) of the current year. Must have been in 4-H for at least 3 years and have carried at least 3 projects. Must have completed a 4-H Record Book in current year applying for Gold Star Award. District information forms will be required with brief descriptions of the 4-H'ers activities, projects, etc. These applications will be submitted to the County Extension Office at designated deadline time.

I Dare You Award

Each year Sutton County will award two (2) senior 4-H'ers (age 14-18 by September 1 of the current 4-H year) with the I Dare You Award.

All senior 4-H'ers are eligible to apply. Interested 4-H'ers must complete the county I Dare You Award application and submit it to the County Extension Office before the deadline.

No 4-H Record Book is required to apply.

A 4-H'er may only receive the I Dare You Award one time in his or her 4-H career.

The I Dare You Leadership Award was first offered in 1941 by William H. Danforth. Mr. Danforth was a successful businessman who dared young people to achieve their highest potential and to influence others through lives of leadership and service. The I Dare You Leadership Award recognizes those who, with a little encouragement, are ready to see themselves as leaders—young adults who are ready to take the dare.

The program is for 4-H participants who are 4-H seniors and have demonstrated personal integrity, lead well-rounded lives and possess a willingness to assume responsibility. They do not need to hold leadership positions currently but should be recognized by their peers and adults who work with them as emerging leaders.

The award consists of two elements:

A personalized award certificate

A copy of "I Dare You"
