Rainwater Harvesting Systems- Billy Kniffen, retired AgriLife Extension rainwater harvesting specialist, Menard.

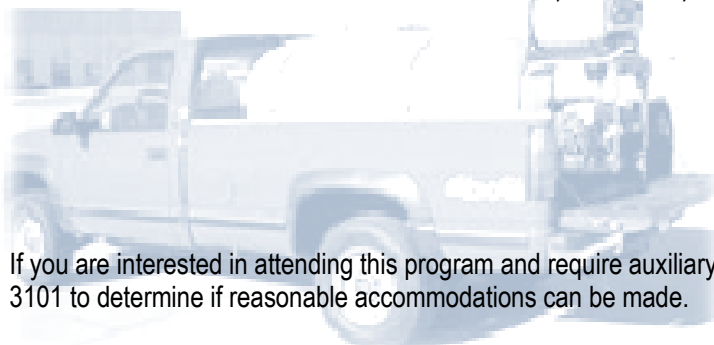
