Aleesha Boyett competed at the 94th ARBA National Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana October 1-5th. There were approximately 22,000 rabbits in the show, which lasted 2 prep days, 3 show days and 1



check out day. There were 100 Flemish Giant rabbits with representation from all 7 varieties. The 7 varieties are black, blue, fawn, light grey, sandy, and white. Aleesha had Best Opposite Sex Fawn, which is second place out of 40 fawn Flemish and her was the buck. She also took Best Display for all Flemish Giants. Her rabbit, Peyton, demonstrated the best qualities for display and presentation on the table during judging and the National Federation of Flemish Giant Rabbit Breeders Association presented her with a trophy. Overall, Aleesha did not place lower than 5th with the 13 rabbits she took to compete with. She even bred, raised and took two fawns. One of the fawns she gave to the man who started her in Flemish. That junior fawn competed in the Open show (adults) and placed 4th out of 29 junior fawns.
