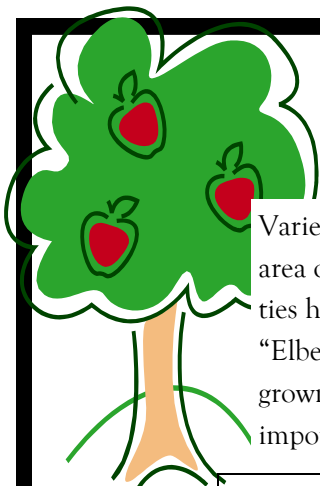


Fruit and Nut Varieties for Tom Green County

Variety selection is one of the most important steps in successful fruit growing. A variety may perform in one area of Texas and be a complete failure in another. For this reason, this list has been prepared. These varieties have demonstrated satisfactory performance for several years. Many of the older varieties such as "Elberta" peach, "Bartlett" pear, or "Stuart" pecan are not recommended for this area. Fruit trees are not grown from seed, but instead are budded or grafted onto suitable rootstock. The correct rootstock is just as important as the variety. Updated 2014
