This year on June 26 through July 1, Waller County sent three 4-H archers to represent Texas at the 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships in Grand Island, Nebraska. Joseph Franklin shot on the recurve archery team, while Samantha Franklin and Catherin Franklin shot on the compound archery team.



Mr. Dan Franklin served as the adult leader volunteer coach of the compound team. This is the 5th year in a row that Waller County has sent participants to the National Competition. In total, there were 679 participants representing 36 states. These archers competed in Field, 3-D and FITA. Joseph Franklin won the National Championship in recurve archery, placing first overall.

4-Her's Take the State Capitol *by Cat and Sam Franklin, Sharp Shooter*

On July 17th through July 20th Waller County sent three 4-H'ers, Samantha Franklin, Catherin Franklin, and John Philip Jones to the Texas 4-H Congress event. This event is only held once every two years, during the off season of the Texas Legislature. Texas 4-H Congress is a mock legislative event, where participants write bills, learn about the law making process, and debate on proposed bills. There were over 300 participants from all over the state representing their counties and 4-H districts. At 4-H Congress participants are divided into the press corps, lobbyists, Senators, and House members. 4-H is one of the few organizations that have the opportunity to use the Texas capitol building. 4-H'ers were able to debate on the actual Senate floor and sit at the Senator's desks. At the event, 4-H'ers were able to debate about current issues, ranging from Texting while driving, to abortion, and even to addressing the overpopulation of feral hogs in Texas. Texas 4-H Congress is a very educational and fun event, and we would encourage everyone to participate.




What is County Council ?
