## 2020 District 10 Horse Show Overview

**\*\*\* The health of our 4-H members is of our utmost concern. As of right now, we are planning on moving forward with hosting District 10 Horse Show as planned. Due to the constantly changing COVID-19 regulations, we will not approve any Horse Show registrations until we are 100% sure that we will be holding the event. Please keep this in mind as registrations will remain "Pending at District" until we are approved to proceed. \*\*\***

### OVERVIEW:

- **Registration:** May 1-29, 2020 via 4-H CONNECT
- **Cost:** \$15 flat fee for each class (exhibitor may enter as many classes as they wish) plus a one-time \$10 participation fee. *(please note you will not be charged until approved at the District Level)*
- **Location:** Dripping Springs Ranch Park; 1042 Event Center Drive; Dripping Springs, TX 78620
- **Dates:** June 17-18, 2020
- **Event Description:** This is a District wide Horse Show Event with multiple categories. This is the only District 10 Qualifying Event to be able to participate in the Texas 4-H Horse Show Qualifying Classes.
- **Who Will Attend:** All 4-H youth with validated horses wishing to participate in the District 10 4-H Horse Show AND would like to participate in the qualifying horse show events to be able to participate in the Texas 4-H Horse Show.
- **Additional Paperwork Requirement:** Please provide a copy of the following items to the County Extension Office by **12:00 Noon on Monday, June 1st, 2020:**
  1. **Current negative Coggins certificate for each horse entered.** Coggins papers must be valid through the District and State Horse Show (July 31, 2020, not just through entry deadline. Dates on Coggins papers must be legible.)
  2. **Medical release for each exhibitor**

### ADDITIONAL DETAILS TO KNOW:

- **Registering for Additional Classes:** Contestants who registered by the May 29, 2020 deadline may add classes at the Horse Show or after registration closes. However, each additional class will cost the original \$15 fee plus another \$25 late registration fee (totaling \$40 per additional class). All added classes must be paid with check only. No refunds will be given.
- **Stalling Information:** Stalls will be reserved and paid for on 4-H Connect ONLY. Stalling assignments will be made by the District 10 Office. Cost for stalls will be \$25 per stall, per night regardless of number of hours used. Shavings will NOT be available for sale. Exhibitors may bring their own. On Tuesday, 6/16/20, Horses may begin stalling NO EARLIER THAN 5:00pm, we will not be prepared for stalling any earlier than that, as we will be hauling in all of our equipment and supplies that day. Stalls must be totally vacated at the conclusion of the show on 6/18/20.
- **Stall Cards:** Exhibitor information cards will be required for each stall in use (they will be hung on your assigned stall) An emergency contact number must be included on stall card for any horse that will remain on the grounds overnight.
- **RV Rental:** RV Rental will be handled through the District 10 4-H Office; they will be reserved and paid for on 4-H Connect. The fee will be \$40 for each RV spot, per night. RV spots are first come, first served. Your assigned RV spot will be given to you upon check-in at the show. An RV Spot does not include a stall for your horse. You must also reserve a stall at the time of registration.
