### OVERVIEW:

- **Registration:** May 18-31, 2021 via 4-H CONNECT
- **Cost:** \$250 per person (please note you will not be charged until approved at the District Level)
- **Location:** Texas 4-H Conference Center; 5600 FM 3021; Brownwood, TX 76801
- **Theme:** Survivor – Outlearn, Outlead, Outserve
- **Event Description:** This is a District wide leadership event where youth ages 13 and up come together to learn and participate in activities focusing on leadership, communication, and teambuilding that they will bring back to their counties. It is a great learning and leadership opportunity!
- **Who Will Attend:** All District 10 Council Officers, Bastrop County 4-H Council Officers, and other representatives from each county. No graduating seniors who are ineligible to participate in 4-H for the 2021-2022 4-H year may attend. However, current officers who are graduating are allowed to attend.
- **Additional Paperwork Requirement:** Please provide **3 original copies of the Health and Release forms** to the County Extension Office by **12:00 Noon on Thursday, May 27, 2021.**
- **Packing List:** will be provided to registered participants at the beginning of June

### OFFICER ELECTIONS:

- **Eligibility:** Any 4-H'er who has ATTENDED LEADERSHIP LAB AT LEAST ONE YEAR PRIOR TO THIS YEAR is eligible to seek an office. Qualified delegates interested in seeking Council office must apply by completing the online application
- **Council Officer Applications:**
  - Available online with standing rules, bylaws, & officer position descriptions at <http://d104-h.tamu.edu/district-4-h-council/>
  - DUE to the District Office by May 31, 2020 via the online application
  - **PLEASE NOTE:** Applications will be accepted online only and it is the candidate's responsibility to ensure their application was received.
- **Election Process/Preparation:**
  - **Speech:** prepare a short speech to help the District members get to know you and understand why you would make a good District Council Officer
  - **Poster:** Candidates who apply will be allowed to bring ONE poster board size (22 inches X 28 inches) campaign poster to Lab! They are also allowed to create a "digital" poster to be submitted to the District Office to be shared on social media. No other campaign materials will be allowed, i.e. candy, flyers, gum, etc.
  - **Q & A:** Candidates will participate in a question/answer session in front of the voting delegates following speeches. Candidates will be sent a list of potential questions at the beginning of June. Each candidate will be asked 2 questions from the list and one question that is not on the list.
