FOOD CHALLENGE

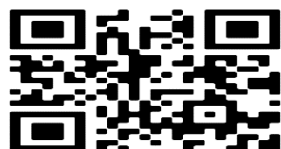
The district food challenge contest will take place in Jacksboro on November 18th. Good luck to all those who are participating!!
