## Other tour/project enrichment ideas:

Go to the Mall or a local shopping center with window displays. Have 4-H'ers judge the window displays according to elements of design, eye appeal, color scheme used, target audience. Award winning store with a certificate from your club. Talk to the display designer, if possible.
