RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors will be under the control of the FCCLA Chairpersons (one from George West and one from Three Rivers). The Organization will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to entries.
2. All projects entered in the FCCLA Division must be the work of the exhibitor and must not have been entered previously in a Live Oak County Fair.
3. Any projects that have ever been entered or been a part of a previous entry in the Live Oak County Fair cannot be entered or be part of an entry at the Live Oak County Fair.
4. **TIME OF ENTRY:**
 - a. All FCCLA, Family and Consumer Sciences and Junior High Family and Consumer Sciences clothing articles must be at the Live Oak County Coliseum between 5:00-6:00 p.m. Wednesday, February 22. Judging starts at 9:00 a.m. Thursday, February 23.
 - b. All **ARTS AND CRAFTS** entries must be in the Live Oak County Coliseum between 5:00-6:00 p.m. Thursday, February 23. Judging starts at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, February 23.
 - c. All **FOOD** entries must be at the Live Oak County Coliseum between 5:00-6:00 p.m. Thursday, March 2. Judging starts at 10:00 a.m.
5. **JUDGING** - All sessions of judging will be closed to all except chairpersons, sponsors, and judges.
6. **ELIGIBILITY** - Students eligible for entry in the FCCLA Show must be enrolled in a Family and Consumer Sciences Class or be in FCCLA.
7. There will be a designated section for each class and division.
8. **APPLICATION FOR ENTRY** - All entries must be checked through the committee chairperson and must carry the official entry label.
9. **INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES:**

CLOTHING - An exhibitor cannot enter more than one clothing entry in a class and can enter no more than two classes.

FOODS - An exhibitor can enter no more than one food entry in a class and can enter no more than two classes.

ARTS & CRAFTS - An exhibitor can enter no more than one arts and crafts entry in a class and can enter no more than two classes.
10. All articles must be labeled with the official label.
11. All garments must be entered in the judging and exhibited at the fair. If entries are not on display at the fair, premium money will not be paid to the exhibitor.



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12. **RIBBON AWARDS** - The top three entries in each class will receive a Rosette and the top entry will receive \$5.00 additional premium money. Top entries will be chosen by division judges from blue ribbon winners. Each article exhibited will be awarded a ribbon according to its score:
 - a. 100-90 Blue Ribbon
 - b. 89-80 Red Ribbon
 - c. 79-70 White Ribbon
 - d. 69 & Under Pink Ribbon

13. **AWARDS** - Three over all high point county winners will be awarded a trophy. High Point individual will be determined by a total of the five highest of six scores. Prize money will be given in the order below, according to over-all high points. In case of a tie, additional trophies and money will be awarded.
 - a. 1st Place \$25.00
 - b. 2nd Place \$20.00
 - c. 3rd Place \$15.00

14. **AUCTION** - Blue Rosette winning foods with recipes will be eligible to be auctioned off Friday, March 3 at 12:00 Noon, if exhibitor so chooses. Entry container may be decorated.

15. **THANK YOU** - Students with entries in the rosette winning Food Auction must submit to their Family and Consumer Science Teacher a stamped thank you note to the buyer of their entry before they can receive the premium sale money.

16. No articles on exhibit may be removed from the fairgrounds before 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, and must be claimed by 4:00 p.m. on Saturday. All entries must be checked out by the committee chairperson.



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Family, Career and Community Leaders of America **FCCLA CLOTHING DIVISION**

1. There can only be two entries per individual.
2. All FCCLA, Family and Consumer Science and Junior High Family and Consumer Sciences Clothing articles must be at the Live Oak County Coliseum between 5:00 - 6:00 p.m. Wednesday, February 22.
3. All garments will be modeled for judges on Thursday, February 23 at 9:00 a.m. at the Coliseum.
4. All garments entered must be completed. Any incomplete or unfinished garment will be disqualified.

- Class 3- Pants - Girls (Junior High Only)
- Class 4- Pants - Boys (Junior High Only)
- Class 5- Shorts - Girls (Junior High Only)
- Class 6- Shorts - Boys (Junior High Only)
- Class 7- Dresses or Rompers (Junior High Only)
- Class 8- Skirt (First Year High School Students Only)
- Class 9- Pants (First Year High School Students Only)
- Class 10- Shorts (First Year High School Students Only)
- Class 11- Blouse or Shirt (First Year High School Students Only)
- Class 12- Men's Apparel (For Boys Only)
- Class 13- Children's Clothes
- Class 14- Dresses or Rompers
- Class 15- Hostess or At-Home Wear
- Class 16- Skirt, Shorts, Pants or Shirts

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FCCAL FOODS DIVISION

1. No meat allowed in baked goods
2. Non-edible decorations will not be allowed on any entry. If you submit your entry on cardboard you may cover it in freezer paper or foil.
3. There can only be two entries per individual and only one entry per individual per class.
4. Each entry must have the complete recipe taped to it. Chairpersons will make the decision on how many points will be deducted. Deductions can be from 1-10 points. Recipe to include: title, pan size, oven temperature, baking time, list of ingredients and instructions.
5. Each entry must be enclosed in a clear plastic bakery box.
6. No mixes allowed except in Class 3- Specialty Cookies or Bars, Class 4- Quick Breads and Specialty Quick Breads, Class 5- Sweet Quick Breads and Specialty Sweet Quick Breads, and Class 12 – Specialty Cakes. For Class 3- Specialty Cookies or Bars, Class 4- Quick Breads and Specialty Quick Breads, Class 5- Sweet Quick breads and Specialty Sweet Quick Breads, and Class 12- Specialty Cakes, entries which consist of just a mix do not meet entry specifications, and will be disqualified.
7. All frostings must be made from scratch or entry will be disqualified. Non-dairy whipped topping will not be allowed.
8. All pie crust and pie fillings must be made from scratch. Use of canned fruit in a recipe is acceptable, but **if fruit filling or commercially prepared (bought) pie crust is used, entry will be disqualified.**
9. No chiffon or sponge cakes allowed. Chiffon cakes and sponge cakes will be disqualified in all classes.
10. No unbaked cookies allowed. All unbaked will be disqualified.
11. Any cake left in pan will automatically be disqualified.
12. All foods must include recipe to be sold in bake sale or auction.
13. Entry that requires refrigeration will not be accepted.
14. Chairpersons or a Family Consumer Science Teacher shall have the final decision on entries or on disqualifications.

CLASSES OF ENTRIES AND ENTRY SPECIFICATIONS:

CLASS 1 - COOKIES

Each entry must consist of not less than two dozen cookies in a clear plastic bakery box. NO UNBAKED COOKIES.

CLASS 2 - BAR COOKIES

Each entry must consist of not less than two dozen cookies in a clear plastic bakery box. NO UNBAKED COOKIES.

CLASS 3 - SPECIALTY COOKIES OR BARS

Premix base with ingredients added to change color, texture, or flavor. Entry must consist of not less than two dozen cookies in a clear plastic bakery box. NO UNBAKED COOKIES.



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CLASS 4 - QUICK BREADS & SPECIALTY QUICK BREAD

Each entry must consist of a loaf or entire batch of items in a clear plastic bakery box. No mini-loaves unless entire batch is entered. Specialty quick breads must have a premix base with ingredients added to change color, texture, or flavor.

CLASS 5 - SWEET QUICK BREADS & SPECIALTY SWEET QUICK BREADS

Each entry must consist of a loaf or entire batch of items in a clear plastic bakery box. No mini-loaves unless entire batch is entered. Specialty sweet quick breads must have a premix base with ingredients added to change color, texture, or flavor.

CLASS 6 - FRUIT PIES

Pies can be entered in either a regular pie plate or disposable pie plate and exhibited in a clear bakery box. If an FCCLA student enters a pie in a regular pie plate and desires to sell the pie, the pie plate will not be returned. NO CUSTARD PIES.

CLASS 7 - NUT PIES

Pies can be entered in either a regular pie plate or disposable pie plate and exhibited in a clear bakery box. If an FCCLA student enters a pie in a regular pie plate and desires to sell the pie, the pie plate will not be returned. NO CUSTARD PIES.

CLASS 8 - LAYER CAKES

Cake MUST have a MINIMUM OF TWO LAYERS. Cake must be in a clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 9 - SINGLE LAYER CAKES

Cake MUST be a SHEATH or SINGLE LAYER. Cake must be removed from pan. Cake must be in clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 10 - BUNDT CAKES

Cake must be baked in a BUNDT or TUBE pan. Cake must be in a clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 11 - POUND CAKE

RECIPE TITLE MUST SPECIFY THE WORD "POUND." Cakes must be in a clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 12 - SPECIALTY CAKES

Premix base with ingredients added to change color, texture, or flavor. Cakes must be in a clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 13 - YEAST BREADS

Entry must consist of entire batch. Entry must be in a clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 14 - SWEET YEAST BREADS

Entry must consist of entire batch. Entry must be in a clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 15 - CANDY

Entry must consist of entire batch of candy. Entry must be in a clear plastic bakery box.

CLASS 16- SUGAR FREE FOODS

Entry may consist of any foods in the above classes. Must meet the same qualifications of the above class. Entry must be considered sugar free and may be gluten free as well. Entry must be in a clear plastic bakery box.
