




Milam County 4-H Clover Kids Parents Guide 2016-2017




It is a program designed to provide youth in grades K-2 with a variety of educational and recreational experiences. It is the officially recognized 4-H program in Milam County for children under age 8.


4-H Awards Recordbooks

No, they cannot go to an overnight camp but they can go to Day Camps! The Milam County 4-H Fun Day Camp is in July. The camp involves the youth in a one-day setting where educational, hands-on activities occur. There are other camps such as Water Day Camp and FCS Day Camp they can attend as well!

4-H Clover Kid Recordbook

A 4-H Clover Kid Recordbook is a written history of a Clover Kid's journey through 4-H. Keeping a 4-H Clover Kid Recordbook is part of the overall 4-H experience. It also helps a Clover Kid to make future plans (goals), learn organization, helps them to make decisions and to remember to just have fun while they learn.

Completing a 4-H Clover Kid Recordbook can make a Clover Kid feel good about themselves. They can say "Look at what I did....."

As a Clover Kid grows in 4-H, documenting what they have done is an important step to future endeavors. Everything that is documented now can be used when a Clover Kid turns into a 4-H'er.

At each Clover Kid meeting, an activity page will need to be filled out telling of what experience took place for that day.

Near the end of the 4-H year a completed 4-H Clover Kid Recordbook will need to be turned in at the last 4-H Club Meeting. The recordbook will be returned to the Clover Kid at the 4-H Annual Awards Banquet and they will receive an award at the 4-H banquet.
